### **DARIE DUP**

Darie Dup (b. 1959) is a Romanian sculptor, widely regarded as one of the most gifted and distinctive artists of his generation. His work has been featured in many group exhibitions, both in Romania and internationally. Notable appearances include the Venice Biennale, the World Expo in Seville, the International Sculptor's Drawing Biennale in Budapest, and the Contemporary Art Biennale in Tulcea.

His sculptures have been displayed at esteemed venues such as the National Gallery of Contemporary Art in Mumbai, as well as galleries in Paris, Madrid, Lisbon, Rome, Riga, and Berlin. Additionally, his art is part of prominent collections in the Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, Italy, France, and the USA.

As a member of the Royal Society of Sculpture, Dup is known for his tempered expressionism and profound moral insights. His work often delves into anatomical fragments and their dramatic presentation, combining a unique blend of anthropocentrism with rebellion. His style has evolved over time, transitioning from neo-expressionist figurative sculpture to a more avant-garde, Pop Art-influenced approach. In recognition of his contributions, he was awarded the Cultural Merit Order at the rank of Knight in 2004 and received the Excellence Award from the Union of Visual Artists in 2007.
