# DRAGOŞ LUMPAN

Dragoş Lumpan is a renowned Romanian photographer and filmmaker with an academic background in both film and theology. He has held exhibitions in prominent art institutions like the National Museum of Contemporary Art of Romania, at the Romanian Peasant Museum and at the Museum of Recent Art in Bucharest.

Internationally, his work has been showcased in Turkey, Italy, the UK, Spain, Hungary, Austria, Luxembourg, and the USA. His photography has been recognized at prestigious venues, including the European Central Bank's annual photography award exhibitions.

His early passion for photography began at the age of 14, when he developed his first photographs on film. This passion eventually expanded to cinematography, leading him to tell stories through both mediums, capturing people in their natural environments and the essence of their lives.

His acclaimed project "The Last Transhumance" stands as a testament to his dedication to documenting vanishing traditions. Begun in 2007, this project involved photographing and filming shepherds practicing transhumance across six countries: Romania, Turkey, Greece, Albania, Italy, and Wales. Over 15 years, Lumpan covered over 50,000 kilometers, capturing 100,000 photographs and 100 hours of film and audio recordings. This project highlights the ancient practice of moving livestock seasonally between pastures, portraying the dwindling number of shepherds who continue this way of life.
